R. Craig Nation is a native of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and was educated at Villanova University (B.A. in History and Political Science) and Duke University (Ph.D. in Russian Studies and Contemporary History). He has served as an instructor at the Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies, Cornell University, and the U.S. Army Russian Institute in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Germany. Professor Nation has been Professor of Strategy and Director of Russian and Eurasian Studies at the U.S. Army War College since 1996. He also works as co-chair of the Partnership for Peace Consortium Greater Black Sea Area Forum and South Caucasus Working Group, as Professor of Security Studies at Dickinson College in Carlisle, Pennsylvania, and is a member of the Academic Council of the Institute for East Central European and Balkan Studies at the University of Bologna in Bologna, Italy.

Professor Nation specializes in the security affairs of contemporary Europe and Eurasia with special emphasis on the Russian Federation. He has served as a political adviser on Russian affairs to numerous governmental agencies. Significant publications include: *The Soviet Union and the Middle East* (1983); *War on War: The Origins of Communist Internationalism* (1989/2010); *Black Earth, Red Star: A History of Soviet Security Policy 1917-1991* (1992); *Turkey Between East and West* (1996); *War in the Balkans 1991-220* (2004); *Security in the West: Evolution of a Concept* (2009); and *Shaping South-East Europe's Security Community for the 21st Century* (2012).
